These musical groups range in cost from \$300 to \$2,500 per unit, with the total parade cost of over \$10,000. Electric Parade Float Rules & Etiquette

- 1. Quality of Floats: All floats must be built sturdily and need to withstand the full journey. Recommended pre-parade vehicle check-up: gas tanks FULL, oil changed, double-check tire wear & pressure on all vehicles and trailers (a defect or flat in the middle of a parade is **NOT** a good thing).
- 2. Speed and Safety: All drivers need to adhere to all instructions given by parade line-up officials. The speed at which floats are to be traveling at can be described as a "creep" (1-3 miles per hour). The purpose of the speed is safety and of course to be seen by on-lookers. Keep a **minimum** distance of 30' between you and the float in front of you. Be constantly scanning the street and side walks in front of you. We don't need any accidents. **PLEASE DO NOT BLOW HORNS DURING THE PARADE!** (This frequently scares and may harm small children and affects musical performances).
- 3. Candy: Candy may **only** be distributed to spectators by participants that walk along the side of their float. The potential for injury for parade spectators who "dive" toward candy thrown from a moving float is too large to ignore. It would only take ONE unnecessary incident/accident to discontinue the parade forever. Any parade float participants violating this request will be told to leave the parade and will not be asked to participate in future parades. **NO SUPERBALLS.** These look like candy and can cause a choking hazard with children that may not know the difference.
- 4. No animals allowed.
- 5. No alcohol is to be allowed on or distributed by parade floats/participants.
- 6. Deadline: All float entry forms MUST arrive by noon on Monday, June 9th, 2025. All entries received after this will be placed at the end of the parade! **There is NO rain date**.
